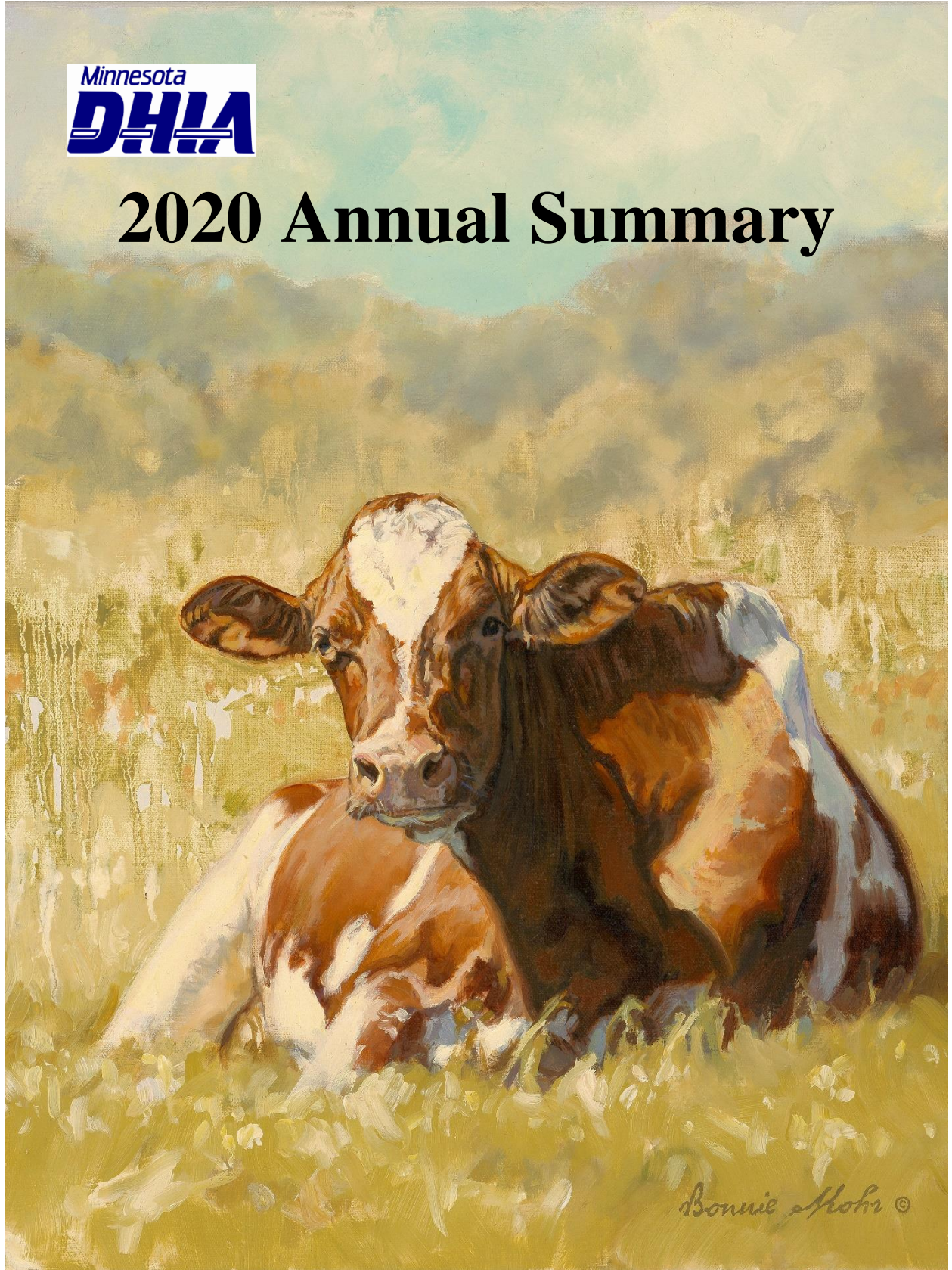
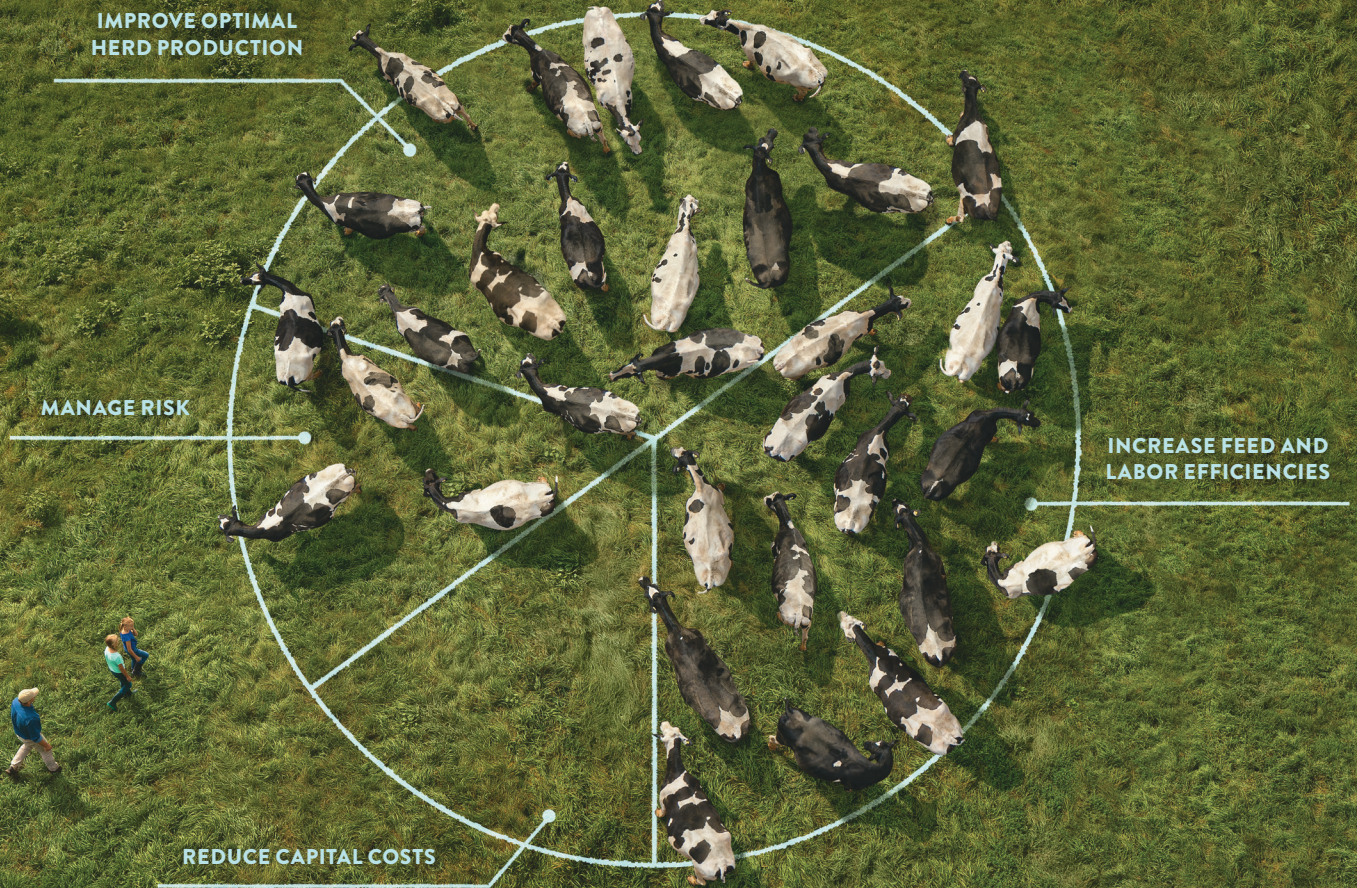

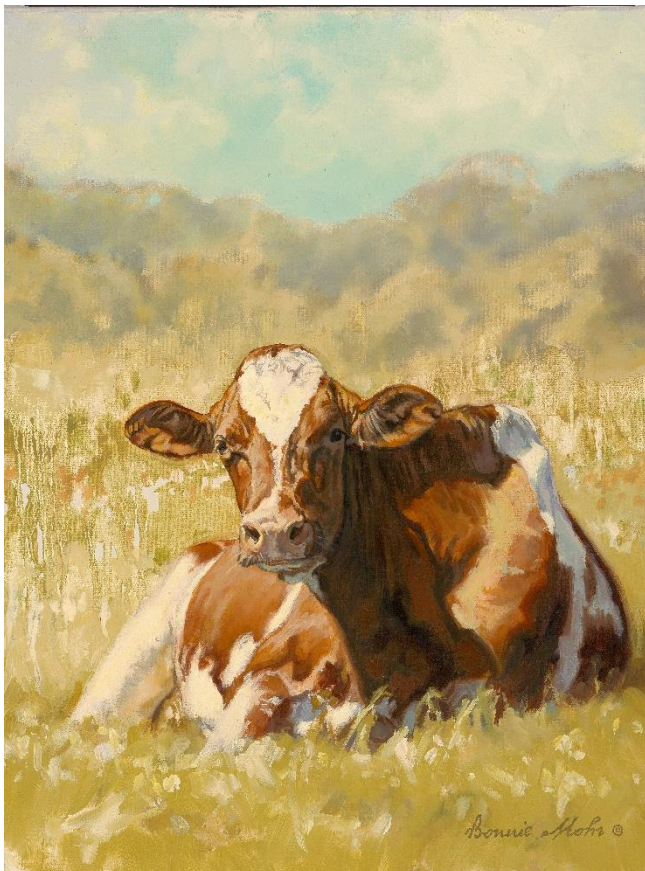

Thanks to our field, lab, and administrative staffs for their ever-changing roles and responsibilities, and for caring about our members.

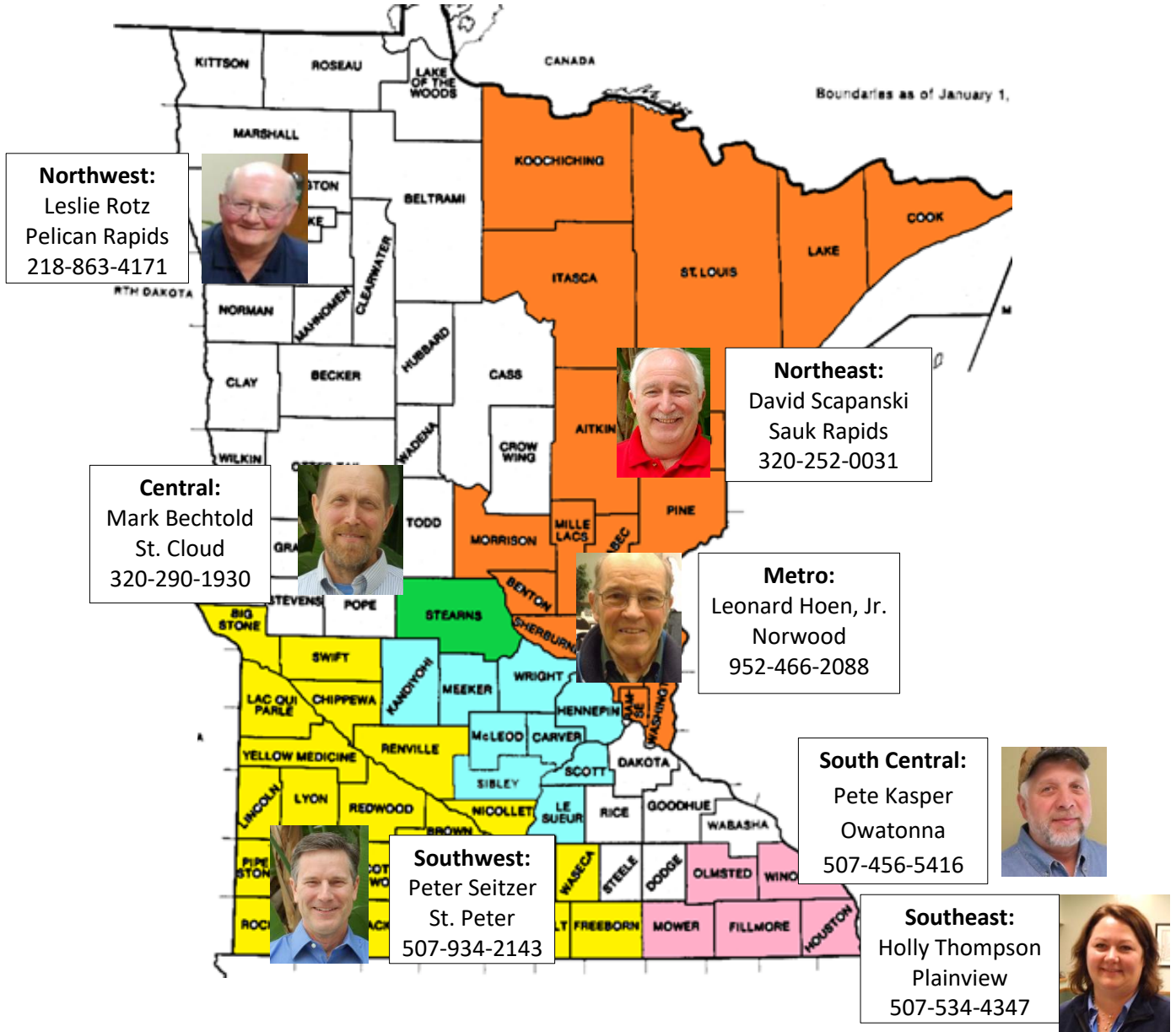

Manager's Report

Thank you.

Your participation in DHIA has far reaching effects beyond your dairy, but that is likely not why you use DHIA services. Your data has allowed for generations of genetic progress and for evaluating management strategies. Data from 4 million cows each month has provided a very powerful and accurate research database. Your data enabled scientists, lead by USDA, to develop genomic testing and will provide the basis for new traits and recalibration of the old ones as we move forward. Your data funneled through the genetics that move from the U.S. to the international market have provided a great source of nutrition, especially to children around the world. The incidence of Ricketts in children has dropped significantly due to the addition of milk to kid's diets, made affordable by genetics and management imported from the U.S.

Thank you for your good and dedicated work in caring for your animals all day, every day. Given the milk price, labor and feed issues, and ever-changing weather of the past couple of years, it probably isn't as rewarding or as much fun to dairy as it used to be.

Thank you for how well you treat our field and support people when they visit your farm or on the phone or email or text. Your positive attitude inspires us all.

We plan to continue to march forward using the new technologies and staying focused on the good old basics.

- You will be seeing alerts sent to your smart phone as soon as data is available after each sample day. The alerts will cover SCC, repro, and more. And they are free.
- You will also be able to use your smart phone to look at and report events on cows.
- New milk sample tests hold great promise and are being developed and tested.

Please remember that with DHIA, you have a certified field person using internationally approved and certified meters tested in an approved meter center annually. And you have lab services that are certified and whose value is well documented. And you have certified data handling that brings in data from more sensors each year, contributing to the usability of the information on your dairy, and in the world.

Selective Dry Cow Therapy

Dry cow therapy

Intramammary infusion with long-acting antibiotics at dry off (dry cow therapy) is a long-standing practice in the dairy industry and for good reason.

- Dry cow therapy (DCT) is associated with:
 - curing existing infections at dry off.
 - decreased risk of new infections during the dry period.
 - reduced risk of clinical mastitis in early lactation.
 - decreased somatic cell count (SCC) in early lactation.
- The practice of blanket dry cow therapy (BDCT), treating every cow at dry off, has significantly contributed to reduced prevalence of *Staphylococcus aureus* and *Streptococcus agalactiae*.

What is selective dry cow therapy (SDCT)?

Selective dry cow therapy (SDCT), as opposed to blanket dry cow therapy (BDCT), employs a specific strategy to avoid treating every cow with antibiotics at dry off.

- BDCT accounts for approximately one-third of the total antibiotic use on a conventional dairy.
- SDCT can provide a more targeted approach and a more judicious use of antibiotics without compromising future cow health or performance.
- SDCT programs identify two categories of cows:
 1. Cows eligible for treatment with antibiotics and internal teat sealant.
 2. Cows eligible for treatment with internal teat sealant alone.

Why should producers consider SDCT?

Increasing public concern about antibiotic use in agriculture has led the dairy industry to explore ways to use antibiotics in a more judicious manner.

- BDCT accounts for approximately one-third of the total antibiotic use on a conventional dairy farm, and SDCT has been shown to reduce dry cow antibiotic use by 55%.
- Decreased use of antibiotics also means that producers have the opportunity to save money with a SDCT program.
- A cost-saving calculator is available through the UMN College of Veterinary Medicine dairyKnow website (<https://dairyknow.umn.edu/research/udder-health/selective-dry-cow-therapy-cost-calculator/>).

What dairy farms have the best chance of SDCT success?

SDCT is not the correct choice for every producer. Specific herd criteria help identify when an SDCT program is most appropriate to implement and include:

- An annual bulk tank somatic cell count (SCC) less than 250,000 cells/ml.

- Contagious mastitis pathogens are under control (low numbers of *Staphylococcus aureus* and *Streptococcus agalactiae*).
- Use of teat sealant in all quarters of all cows at dry off.
- Correct technique for intramammary infusions at dry off.
- Well-trained personnel to make correct screening and treatment decisions.
- The ability to monitor the program to verify it is working.

How to identify which cows to treat with antibiotics in a SDCT program

There are two approaches to classify cows in a SDCT program, an algorithm guided method, and a culture guided method. Herds that routinely test with DHIA or have access to similar data can use an algorithm guided method to categorize cows. Those herds without access to reliable SCC and clinical mastitis records may need to use a culture guided method.

- Algorithm guided and culture guided SDCT programs both show a similar reduction in dry cow therapy antibiotic use.
- There is no difference in effectiveness between the two methods in terms of significant cow health or production outcomes according to a multi-herd, multi-state study led by University of MN researchers (Rowe, et al, 2020).
- While both approaches had a positive average net return, there is potentially a greater cost-savings associated with an algorithm guided SDCT program if adequate DHIA records are already available.

What cows are eligible for the two treatment groups in an SDCT program?

Algorithm guided SDCT

Specific criteria have been developed to identify the two groups of cows in an algorithm guided SDCT program.

Cows eligible for treatment with antibiotics and internal teat sealant in all four quarters (meet ANY or ALL criteria)	Cows eligible for treatment with internal teat sealant alone in all four quarters (meet ALL criteria)
SCC greater than 200,000 at any test during the current lactation	SCC less than 200,000 for all tests during the current lactation
Any clinical mastitis cases in the last 14 days of lactation	No clinical mastitis in the last 14 days of lactation
2 or more clinical mastitis cases during the current lactation	Less than 2 clinical mastitis cases during the current lactation

Culture guided SDCT

In culture guided SDCT, aseptic milk samples are collected 2 days before dry-off and cultured to identify subclinical mastitis that would require treatment with dry cow antibiotics. Inexpensive rapid culture may be conducted on the farm for farms with a milk culture lab already in place, or may be conducted in the local veterinary clinic. In addition to culture results, producers may use additional information gathered from SCC and clinical mastitis records to determine cow eligibility for treatment. There are two culture guided methods for SDCT.

Quarter sampling culture

UMN studies show that each quarter of the udder can be cultured and categorized separately. A positive culture makes the quarter eligible for antibiotics and internal teat sealant, while a negative culture is eligible for internal teat sealant alone. The Minnesota Easy® 4Cast® plate is designed for quarter culture use and is available through the UMN Laboratory for Udder Health (www.vdl.umn.edu/services-fees/udder-health-mastitis).

Composite sampling culture

Sampling all quarters of the udder and combining those into one sample is also an option for culture guided SDCT. This method reduces dry cow therapy antibiotic use, but less so than for the quarter sampling culture approach or the algorithm guided methods.

How to monitor a SDCT program

As with any big decision on a dairy, it is crucial to work with the herd veterinarian to monitor and evaluate the program. An ideal monitoring program includes continual evaluation of milk quality and the SDCT program:

- Regular bulk tank cultures to screen for contagious pathogens.
- SCC testing.
- Routine culture of clinical and chronic mastitis cases.
- Monitoring cows for mastitis during the dry period, particularly just after dry off.
- Monitoring clinical mastitis rate and SCC in early lactation
- Veterinary involvement and evaluation of records.
- For herds using the culture approach, monitor the cleanliness of samples, since a high contamination rate will result in unnecessary use of antibiotics, reducing the net-return of the program.

Keys to success

Successful SDCT programs are highly dependent on a few key factors.

- Use of an internal teat sealant in quarters not treated with dry cow antibiotics
- A proper intramammary infusion technique is essential. Failure to follow aseptic technique can result in the introduction of harmful pathogens to the udder. Well trained, vested employees are crucial.

- Veterinary involvement is strongly encouraged to help set protocols, train employees, and monitor the program. In some cases the herd veterinarian could also provide trained, experienced veterinary technicians to do sampling and/or to conduct dry-off procedures.
- SDCT is not something all herds should implement. Producers should work with their veterinarian to make sure an SDCT program is right for their herd using the appropriate herd criteria.

DHIA can help

Starting in October 2020, MN DHIA can provide a selective dry cow therapy report to eligible herds. The report is the result of a collaboration between MN DHIA and University of Minnesota SDCT researchers.

- The DHI-370 Flex Report will include cows to dry off in the next 45 days and will highlight potential candidates for internal teat sealant alone.
- The producer will be responsible for checking the candidate cows for a history of clinical mastitis and that would make them ineligible for treatment with internal teat sealant alone.
- Herds eligible for the report should meet the following criteria: 8 or more DHI test days with SCC data, an annual DHI herd average SCC less than 250,000, and less than 3 DHI herd tests with average SCC greater than 250,000.

The Minnesota Board of Animal Health closed the last open investigation related to the importation of cattle possibly exposed to bovine tuberculosis (TB) in January 2021. The Wisconsin TB affected dairy herd resulted in 179 investigations. Most of these cattle that were still alive and hadn't yet left the state, were dairy steers that were quarantined until slaughter. Four investigations were initiated including cattle that originated from the TB affected dairy in Texas. Six investigations were due to imported cattle from an affected North Dakota herd. South Dakota's affected beef herds resulted in 128 investigations. No TB has been identified in cattle in Minnesota during any of the 317 investigations.

In October 2019, the USDA suspended its plan (announced April 2019) to phase out visual only official identification (ID) ear tags and replace them with 840 pre-fix radio frequency ID (RFID) ear tags. The USDA opened a comment period in July 2020 to seek public input on this proposed transition and the timeline associated with it. The comment period closed in October 2020 and decisions have not yet been shared by the USDA as to the final decision on this proposed plan. The Board supports movement towards this transition and has been working with the USDA, which is offering official white button ½ duplex RFID tags to livestock producers and accredited veterinarians at no cost to them, for use in replacement heifers. This is a limited program where Minnesota is eligible for a total of just over 200,000 RFID tags through September 30, 2021. Producers or veterinarians who received an order of RFID tags under this program prior to October 1, 2020, are eligible to place a second order through September 30, 2021. The order should include the total number of RFID tags needed for replacement heifers for the year, up to 200 tags per producer. Orders are placed through the Board's website. The request form can be found under the 'Forms' dropdown.

Official RFID tags continue to be available for purchase from multiple manufacturers and livestock producers and veterinarians also continue to have the ability to purchase visual official tags from multiple sources until the USDA lifts its suspension and identifies a new phase-out timeline.

The Board received limited funds through two separate USDA supplement agreements to purchase RFID equipment. The first agreement covered equipment for use in livestock concentration points. The Board selected concentration points that process the highest numbers of RFID tagged cattle to utilize the equipment. The second agreement is intended to cover a number of small, lightweight, durable RFID readers for use by accredited veterinarians and concentrations points, but the equipment purchase has still not been finalized.

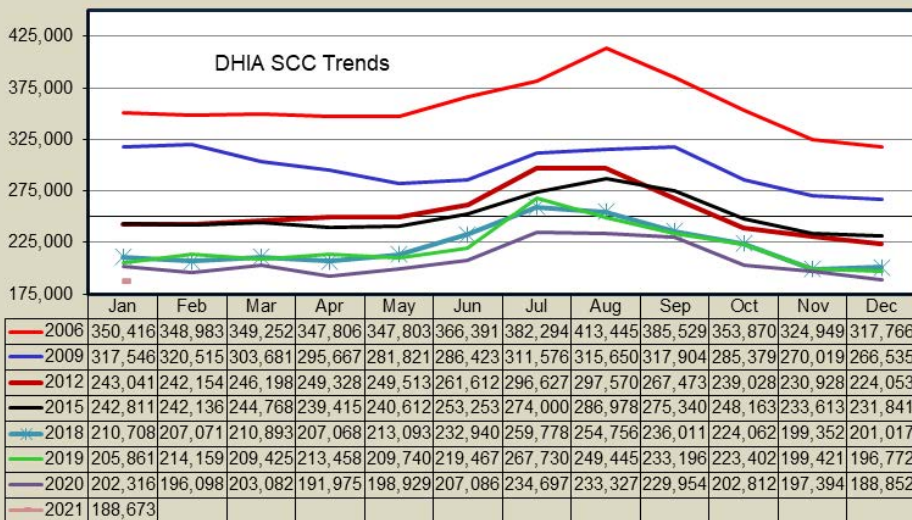

NIR Forage Testing

A new cooperative agreement with Cumberland Valley Analytical Services is in place that allows us to utilize the equations and expertise of this premier feed and forage lab in providing results to our customers.



Animal Waste Lab

Cheri Ladwig is our chemist and has been with us for 17 years. Brandon Gamradt assists and together they analyzed over 8,200 animal waste samples in 2020 in the Chemistry Lab. 59% of samples are from swine producers.
