Price changes in 2024

With ever increasing costs in lab, field, and administration we will be increasing the base price for herds by a few cents per cow to help cover postage, workers compensation insurance, liability insurance, speedee delivery, gas prices, and health insurance benefits as well as the cost of lab chemicals for standard tests as well as the ELISA tests.

We are involved with National DHIA and some international DHIAs in the development of a new meter that is designed to be smaller and lighter and sample directly into the vial that is shipped to the lab. This should save time on sample day and enable easier sampling in some of the low line parlors but it requires an investment.

The scorecard for 2024 use is included in this member message as well. It is designed to help you pinpoint the areas where you excel as a manager, as well as identifying opportunities for improved production and profit. There is a cheat sheet on our website (mndhia.org) to make it easier to find the data if you are having trouble.

Highlights from 2024 Member meetings


