

Check out your Free Report: Herd Evaluator

What's your herd's status? This month's free report, Herd Evaluator, provides a summary of your herd's performance. This report shows your current test day, previous test day and your test day a year ago, and the top 25% of herds so you can compare 5 key areas, including milk yield, milk quality, turnover, reproduction, and herd inventory. Each of these categories includes a colorful graph of your progress over the last twelve tests on the left side of the page. This is especially useful for pointing out the seasonality in some numbers (such as pregnancy rates and somatic cell counts, both of which tend to get worse in warmer months).



From the graph you can easily see that this herds pregnancy and conception rates have been declining since May. Have you changed breeding technicians? What else has changed on your farm?
