I've got a great memory

Test don't guess has been the motto for DHIA for many years, and this statement is still true. Now how about record rather than remember. You have a million things happening on your farm every day. This makes it crucial to keep records, whether they are electronic or hand written. "Without records it's just guessing", was posted in the June 4, 2018 installment of *Hoard's Dairymen Intel*. One key point to take away is to record ALL disease events not just treatments. This will give you complete records and a better look at your whole herd. Another takeaway is to be consistent in how you record a health event and the remarks for the event. Having good records is important for multiple reasons. Programs like FARM require complete health records. Although the best reason to make this a priority is that you can make data driven decisions on your farm.
